Your students will love these Reading Bookmarks! Here are some suggestions on how to use them:

- Print on white cardstock or print on regular white printing paper and laminate after students have colored.
- Coloring can be a calming activity for many children (and adults). Allow a few minutes of coloring after stressful activities, during indoor recess, or free time.
- Keep a supply available for whenever students want to color.
- Give bookmarks out as rewards.
- Give bookmarks out at the start of the year, after testing, before school vacations, or on Read Across America Day.
- Hide bookmarks in books in your classroom library as a fun surprise.
- Encourage students to color and trade bookmarks with each other.






